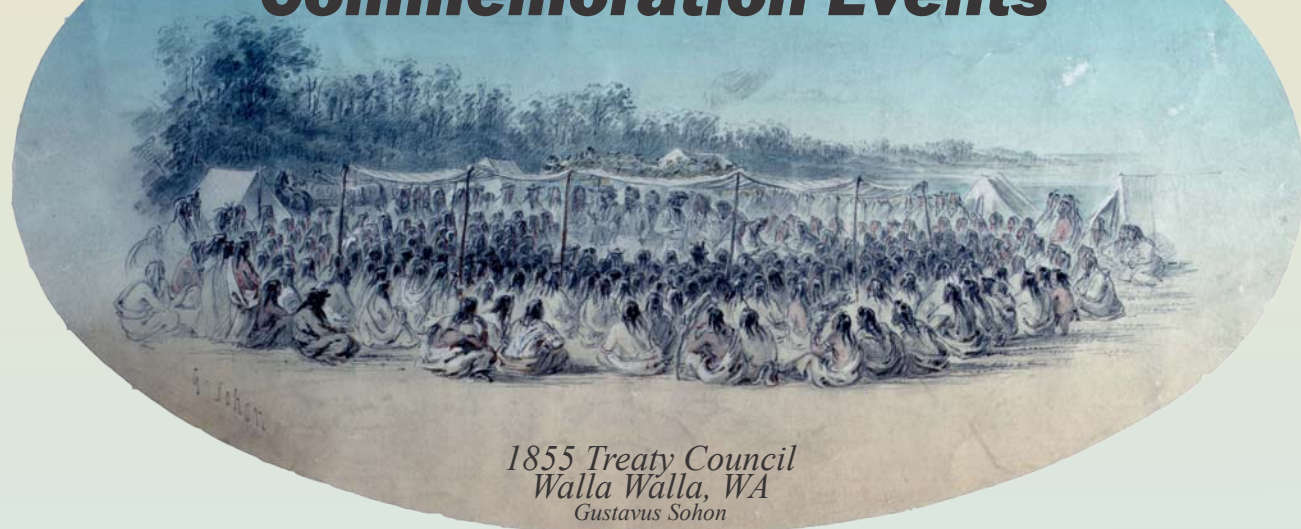

Members of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, Nez Perce Tribe and Yakama Nation will honor their Treaty Signers by parading on horseback, on foot and on truck and trailer (no diesels). The public is invited to observe this historic event that will include talks by Tribal leaders, local officials and state & federal dignitaries. Tribes will provide meat, fish and frybread for the Friendship Feast; the public is encouraged to bring salads, side-dishes and desserts.
