

INTRODUCTION

The following is a summary of regulations that apply to persons who are not members of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation and who wish to hunt within the boundaries of the Umatilla Indian Reservation:

1. Any person who hunts on the lands or in the waters within the boundaries of the Umatilla Indian Reservation shall carry on his/her person at all times, a permit issued to them by the Confederated Tribes which specifically authorizes such activity. Possession of any birds, or parts thereof by persons who do not have a valid tribal permit shall be prima facie evidence that the birds were unlawfully taken;
2. All persons who are not enrolled as Section A or B members of the Confederated Tribes who engage in hunting on reservation lands without a Tribal Permit are subject to federal criminal prosecution pursuant to 18 U.S.C. Section 1165;
3. Tribal permits are not transferable to any other person. Any attempt to transfer a Tribal Permit renders that permit null and void;
4. In addition to possessing a Tribal Permit, any person who hunts within the boundaries of the Umatilla Indian Reservation must comply with the State of Oregon general hunting regulations regarding gear, harvest methods, harvest hours and general restrictions.

REMINDER:

Ask first before hunting lands within the Umatilla Indian Reservation!

Landowners may file trespass charges against individuals hunting on their land without permission. All hunters are required to obey the laws and respect the rights and property of others.

HUNTING SEASONS BAG & POSSESSION LIMITS

SEASONS

Chukar/Hungarian (Gray) Partridge

Season: Oct. 10, 2009 – Jan. 31, 2010
Bag Limit: Daily 8, Possession 24

Rooster Pheasant

Season: Oct. 10 – Dec. 31, 2009
Bag Limit: Daily 2, Possession 8

California Quail

Season: Oct. 10 – Dec. 31, 2009
Bag Limit: Daily 10, Possession 20

Mountain Quail

CLOSED

Duck and Merganser

Season: Oct. 17 – Oct. 25, 2009 and
Oct. 28, 2009 – Jan. 31, 2010
Bag Limit: Daily 7(a), Possession 14(a)

- (a) Within the daily bag limit of seven ducks you may not have more than: two hen mallards, two pintail, two redheads, one canvas back and three scaup. The possession limit is double the daily bag limit.

Goose

Season: Oct. 17 – Oct. 25, 2009 and
Nov. 7, 2009 – Jan. 31, 2010
Bag Limit: Daily 4 dark (b) & 6 white
Possession 8 dark (b) & 12 white

- (b) The daily dark goose limit may not include more than one cackling Canada goose or one Aleutian goose. The possession limit is double the daily bag limit.

Spring Turkey – 2010

Season: April 15 – May 31, 2010
Bag Limit: 1 male or a turkey with a visible beard
Season Limit: 2 legal turkeys
Youth Hunt *Season:* April 10-11, 2010
Bag Limit: 1 male or a turkey with a visible beard
Season Limit: 1 legal turkey

Spring Gobbler Turkey hunting in special designated area only (refer to 2010 hunt area map).

Field Dressing of Game Birds

Hunters understand the importance to care for meat while in the field to protect it from spoiling. However, what is not understood by many is the legal requirements necessary to transport dressed birds from the field. Some hunters commonly practice “breasting” birds out and discarding the rest of the carcass while still in the field. This is not legal and hunters need to note the following:

- For upland game birds, the feathered head must be left attached to all cleaned birds while in the field or traveling home.

- For waterfowl, a feathered head or wing must be left attached to all cleaned birds while in the field traveling home.

There are many restrictions on sex and species of birds that can be included in your daily bag. Leaving a head or wing attached allows law enforcement personnel to identify the birds taken by a hunter. You can be cited if it is not possible to determine the types of birds taken.

It is important to note that the hunter must retain all edible portions of the carcass. The practice of taking only portions of the meat of a game bird (such as breasting birds out) is illegal.
